【One year course】

- Japanese language education(6 months)

The Center for International Education and Research offers an intensive Japanese language education during the first six months.

Supplementary course at the Center for International Education and Research is available. Furthermore, an appointed advisor of the Faculty gives supplementary lessons at any time.

- Specialized training(1 year)

Each student pursues his major field of study under the guidance of an academic advisor for one year.

【One and a half year course without Japanese language education】

※Only for those with sufficient Japanese language ability.

- Specialized training(1 and a half year)

Each student pursues his major field of study under the guidance of an academic advisor for one and a half year.

- Participatory subjects such as field trips and regional exchanges

Each student is recommended to visit K-12 schools in Tsu or near Mie University, and to talk to students about his/her school lives in the native country.

- Others

Students can join events organized by the Center for International Education and Research.

◇ Accommodations

Mie University has three accommodations for international students. One of them, Foreign Students' Dormitory is a place where international students and Japanese students live together to gain global perspectives through cultural interactions.
