CURRICULUM

Integrated Skills (4.5 hours per week)

The course develops the skills and literacies needed to navigate the information-rich world of global English. Students will engage with the inspirational ideas of respected professionals giving talks, and through thought-provoking texts and infographics.

American Culture (3 hours per week)

This course is designed to help students increase their understanding of American cultural patterns and examine how they are different from their own through interactive activities, readings and discussions. Increasing intercultural sensitivity and promoting cross-cultural awareness, tolerance, and greater global understanding are the main goals of the course. Students will learn to predict or avoid problems that may arise due to cultural differences.

Professional Communication (3 hours per week)

This course covers both oral and written professional communication skills. Students will learn about style, tone and cultural considerations in English writing and practice preparing and delivering professional presentations.
