Integrated Skills (4 hrs./week of live classes + 2 hrs./week of online assignments)

This course develops listening, speaking, reading and writing skills at the intermediate level and prepares students to navigate the information-rich world of global English. Students will engage in various activities to practice English including listening tasks, discussions, presentations, reading, and vocabulary practice.

American Culture (3 hrs./week of live classes + 1 hr./week of online assignments)

In this course, students will learn English through American culture. Through interactive activities, readings, and discussions, students will increase their understanding of American cultural patterns, examine how they are different from their own, and learn to predict and avoid problems that may arise due to cultural differences.

Professional Communication (3 hrs./week of live classes + 1 hr./week of online assignments)

This course covers both oral and written professional communication skills. Students will learn to write professional emails, create and deliver effective presentations and elevator pitches, and answer common interview questions. Additionally, students will learn about style, tone and cultural considerations in English writing.
